HOW WE SERVE

We will not rest until all children in need know the love and stability of a forever family. To support this singular mission, Gladney has evolved and added services, as needs have changed from generation to generation.

GLADNEY IMPACTS THE LIVES OF CHILDREN AND PROSPECTIVE ADOPTIVE FAMILIES THROUGH THESE PROGRAMS:

- Domestic Infant Adoptions
- Medically Fragile Infant Adoptions
- Transitional Care: volunteer Gladney foster families provide temporary housing and one-on-one care for infants between delivery and placement with their adoptive families
- Adoptions from Texas Foster Care
- Gladney Home: foster care and adoption advocacy for girls between 11-17 in a group home setting on Gladney's campus
- International Adoptions
- Superkids: volunteer medical professionals complete developmental assessments with children in international orphanages, train orphanage caregivers on best practices for children with special needs, and advocate to find adoptive families

EXPECTANT MOTHER SERVICES:

When a woman chooses adoption for her child, Gladney gives her the support she needs to navigate this new journey, including:

- A dedicated caseworker
- Options counseling
- Housing assistance
- Medical assistance
- Financial and legal support
- Lifetime network of support from other birth mothers and the Gladney team

ONGOING SUPPORT:

Post Adoption Services: Our post adoption team goes above and beyond that of many other adoption agencies. We offer continuing education, resources, guidance, and a supportive network for adoptees, adoptive families, and birth parents.

Family for Life: Our network of Gladney Families is a national community that offers connection for families transformed by adoption. Whether by mentoring a family who is just beginning their adoption journey, advocating for adoption, forming lifelong friendships, or sharing opportunities for ongoing education, the Gladney Family illustrates the deep bonds adoption creates.

EDUCATION & OUTREACH:

Gladney serves communities by meeting the needs of women, children, and families and transforming the public's perspectives about adoption. Adoption is always an option. It can be a proactive prevention to children entering foster care and can be a healing solution for waiting children in foster care. An adoption plan can be made during pregnancy, at the time of delivery, or months or years down the road in the parenting journey.

Gladney University: We work to ensure Gladney's families are never alone, by providing them with education and support before, during, and after their adoption. GU also offers trainings to help counselors, social workers, community members, and medical, education, and child welfare professionals become adoption advocates to support their own clients, employees, students, and neighbors on the adoption journey as an expectant mother, adoptive parent, or adoptee.

AdoptED: Through interactive, in-person and virtual classroom presentations with factual information, we teach students how adoption can reduce the number of children waiting in foster care and provide new opportunities for women experiencing unplanned pregnancies. This program has demonstrated success in creating positive, long-term perception changes about adoption.

OUR HISTORY

In 1887, I.Z.T. Morris began finding adoptive families for children in need, and his compassionate work led to the founding of the Texas Children's Home and Aid Society. Renamed in 1941 after our widely celebrated, long-serving superintendent, Edna Gladney, our modern agency preserves an honored legacy.
